2018 – 2021

EUROPEAN ANTITOTALITARIAN PRACTICES

The course includes studying the totalitarian practices of the power-centrism, class- and clan-struggle, atomization of a person, mythologization and sacralization of ideology, and their possible post-totalitarian reminiscences. The first part of the general program aims at analyzing the essence and functioning of the Soviet totalitarian practices as the basis of post-totalitarianism.

PHILOSOPHY AND CULTURAL STUDIES

T.H. Shevchenko National University «Chernihiv Colehium»

The course is for the second-year students. It's devoted to the study of philosophy and history of philosophy in the context of the cultural process. The course has great importance for the formation of the contemporary European mentality of Ukrainian youth, and thus for the intensification of Ukraine's Euro integration.

The core of the course is questions of European culture and philosophical thought from Ancient Greece to the XXI ct. The students master various methods of the critical thought, and are acquainted with the methodology of the scientific knowledge. The course centers on the philosophical theory of values (axiology), which makes a context of different approaches to the main problems of human existence. While studying, the students have an opportunity of getting knowledge about the formation and development of the contemporary Western values. Special attention is paid to the analysis of the cultural relations of Western and Ukrainian culture and philosophy.

ETHICS

T.H. Shevchenko National University «Chernihiv Colehium»

The course is for the third-year students. The course is devoted to the study of history of the moral consciousness and ethical theories. Special attention is paid to the analysis of the principles of dynamics of Western morality and the main achievements of European ethical thought. The course synthesizes European ethical discourse and the history of Ukrainian ethical thought. It is crucial that studying of the course leads the students to the tolerance to the representatives of the different value systems. The course helps the students in their moral self-identification, develops their ethical reflexing, and forms the readiness to understand representatives of different cultures. The course also includes in-depth studying of European etiquette.
